The program called "Art in Embassies," and the history of quilting in Sierra Leone, helped lead to the honor.

When slaves were freed here in the U.S., many returned to Sierra Leone, bringing with them quilting skills they learned when they were enslaved.

Ambassador Bryan David Hunt lives on the Bay when he is here in the U.S. He was specifically interested in art that brought the Bay to life.

Stufft believes that a Google search of quilts and the Bay brought Hunt to her.



The two quilts illuminate the richness of the Bay, the marshes, the creeks and waterways, and the beautiful quality of the light.

The quilts are still with Stufft, in part because of trouble in Sierra Leone. A courier will take them to the African country when it is safe. They will be there for four years.
